A MESSAGE FROM OUR PASTOR

On Easter Sunday morning, Christians around the world will gather for the observance of the holiest of the holy days, our celebration of the resurrection of Jesus the Christ and experience the joy of knowing and believing that death is defeated – death no longer holds sway over us. And as we gather, as others gather, many will begin their worship, many will greet one another with these words, "Christ is risen;" "He is risen indeed!"

This is a greeting that virtually came into use with the descriptions by the followers of Jesus as they encountered the empty tomb. Matthew, Mark and Luke all contain the words that make up the first part of our Easter greeting as the women went to the tomb to perform their duty and due diligence, discover no body and return to the disciples and declare in various phrasings, "He is risen." Now, true the initial response of the others was not, "He is risen indeed!" but rather one of perplexity, uncertainty, and maybe even a little anxiety.

But, of course, we know the story, we know of the appearances Jesus made to the disciples and others; we know that through their experience it became common usage for the declaration and response to be an ordinary greeting among believers, yet one of extraordinary meaning.

"Christ is risen," "He is risen indeed!"

The thing about this greeting that sticks out to me is the verb tense; it is present, maybe even aorist; but either way such a tense makes sense at the beginning of its use – as the women come from the tomb, it is what is happening at that moment; as the other disciples encounter the risen Christ – it is what is happening at that moment; as the disciples move forward following the ascension – the reality of Christ's resurrection continues to be the center of whatever in their life is happening at the moment.

And we too, still use the greeting with the present tense – "Christ is risen," "He is risen indeed!" It would be understandable, a case could be made, that we could use the greeting with a past tense verb – Christ has risen…, but I wouldn't be in favor of such a change. After all, we believe that our risen Lord still comes to us, still encounters and engages us with the life-giving power of His resurrection.

When we encounter the risen Christ in Word – it is what is happening at that moment; when we encounter the risen Christ in Sacrament – it is what is happening at that moment; we the Spirit enters our hearts and centers our lives on the reality of Christ's resurrection – that is where we find life at that moment.

Yes, the crucifixion, the empty tomb, the physical resurrection appearances all are events that chronologically occurred years and years ago – but the power of God entering this world as one of us, submitting to torture and death so that all may have abundant life; but the reality is the power of those events continues to shape us and mold us into being the people whom God created us to be.

Christ is Risen, He is risen indeed!

A MESSAGE FROM OUR PARISH NURSE

Combine Spiritual Practice and Exercise for a Healthy Heart

People often look to maximize the benefits of their diet and exercise regimens to make every minute they spend in the gym as beneficial as possible. A new study says that combining two common exercises can drastically help do just that, at least when it comes to lowering heart disease risk factors.

The study by the American College of Cardiology, says that when people with heart disease practiced yoga in addition to aerobic exercise, their blood pressure, body mass index and cholesterol levels went down twice as much as patients who practiced either one alone.

In total, researchers looked at 750 patients who had previously been diagnosed with coronary heart disease. Each was assigned yoga and/or aerobic exercise sessions. Those who did either exercise alone saw similar reductions to the various risk factors, but both were dwarfed by the combined group.

Dr. Thomas Discher, cardiologist at Advocate Good Samaritan Hospital in Downers Grove, IL, said he wasn't too surprised by the study's findings. "It makes sense that a program treating the mind, body and soul through routine physical exercise and stress reduction such as yoga would benefit cardiovascular patients," Dr. Dischersaid. "But the combined effect is great."

As people of faith, we know that our spiritual practices of prayer, meditation, and centering are powerful ways to connect with our Source and find peace. Turns out that these practices help protect and heal our hearts, as well!

Manage Stress for Heart Health

Current life expectancy in the United States is 79 years. Only about 20 percent of our genes determine how long the average person lives. This means that our lifestyle and environment will greatly shape our health and happiness in later years.

"Genetic predisposition is certainly a part of longevity, but, yes, by itself, it may not be enough," says Dr. Beata Styka, a geriatric medicine physician at Advocate Christ Medical Center in Oak Lawn, IL. She explains that while we cannot control or alter our genes, we are in control of our habits and certain environmental factors.

One key thing that we can do to keep our hearts healthy is to keep our stress levels down. "Exercising, staying engaged, eating a healthy diet and spending time with friends and family are all ways that people can relieve stress," says Dr. Styka, who agrees that stress can exacerbate health issues.

She offers these additional four tips for keeping stress in check:

- ☐ Learn to accept that life brings constant change and that there are many things that you cannot change or control.
- □Don't let fear take over and control your life.
- \square Be aware of your limitations. Don't overextend yourself.
- □ Know what you cherish in life and make those things a priority.

Prayer: God who is bigger than anything we can imagine, may we connect ever more deeply to the peace and stillness that we find in you.

Resurrection People...

ELCA Mission Builders Returning...

For the eighth year in a row ELCA Mission Builders will have a crew working in the Western North Dakota Synod. This year's project will be an expansion at Bread of Life Lutheran Church in Minot.
