A MESSAGE FROM OUR PARISH NURSE ALL ABOUT THE KIDS

Building Self-Esteem in Your Child

It's never to early to start helping your child develop healthy self-esteem. A child listens and watches for cues from other people to see what they think about him or her. A child's feelings for others are determined by their feelings toward themselves. Help your child develop a healthy attitude about themselves and the world around them at an early age. Several techniques to build a positive self-concept include:

- 1. View the child as a unique individual—not comparing him/her with others.
- 2. Learn why the child acts the way he/she does. Are they tired, bored, irritable? Are they jealous of the new baby?
- 3. Try to spend special time with your child alone without siblings and others.
- 4. Provide ways for the child to feel successful. Give your child jobs which aren't too easy or difficult. Give honest praise and encouragement to your child. When the child feels like a capable and competent person, he or she has good feelings.
- 5. Give the child plenty of praise, warmth, and physical signs of affection. Children thrive in an atmosphere of love.

Good Mental Health for Your Child

During the school year our children are learning many new things each day. How will you continue this learning throughout the summer? To grow healthy and strong, children should have good food, plenty of sleep, exercise, and fresh air. Children also require emotional nurture to have good mental health. To be both healthy and happy children need love, acceptance, security, protection, independence, faith, guidance, and control. How are you providing for your child's mental health? Do your children know they are accepted and loved? Do your children have a good safe place they can feel sure about? Is there a place where he/she fits in? Do your children know that you as a parent have confidence in them and their ability to do things for themselves? Do you nurture your child's faith through prayer and attending church? Do you show your child by example how to get along with others? Does your child know that there are limits to what he/she is permitted to do and that the parents will hold them to these limits? Take the time to enjoy your children and see them as the special gifts from God that they are.

How to Care for Your Child's Emotional Needs

To grow healthy and strong, children should have good food, plenty of sleep, exercise, and fresh air. Children have emotional needs, too. To have good mental health—to be both healthy and happy—all children require: love, acceptance, security, protection, independence, faith, guidance, and control. Children need to feel that their parents love, want and enjoy them; that they matter very much to someone; that there are people near them who care what happens to them. Every child needs to believe that their parents like them, just the way they are. That they like them all the time and that they accept them. Every child needs to know that they will help them when they must face strange unknown, frightening situations. Parents and adults in the faith community can help—develop a set of moral standards to live by which includes kindness, courage, honesty, generosity, and justice. Just like years ago, we have the responsibility to guide children in their development by showing them through example how to get along with others.







FIRST LUTHERAN CHURCH GENERAL ENDOWMENT FUND

The Endowment Committee met on April 19th to review 12 grant requests totaling \$93,452. However, provisions of the General Endowment Fund only allow \$43,152 to be available for grants during 2017. (The \$43,152 is 5% of \$863,036 which is the 12/31/2017 value of the General Endowment Fund.)

After review and discussion, the Committee recommends funding 8 of the requests which totals \$22,260. The Church Council will meet in early May to review, adjust (if necessary), and approve the recommendations proposed by the Endowment Committee. The results will be published in the next newsletter.

During October of this year, the Endowment Committee will hold a second round of grant requests to award the balance of the available grant funds.

Gospel Seeds - May 2017 A Monthly Update from Western ND Synod Staff

Who will serve? Ministry is not a numbers game, it is all about relationships. Ministry happens as people of God gather around Word and Sacrament working to connect the Holy with everyday life. Ministry happens in worship on Sunday, around the dinner table on Monday and in faithful work any day of the week. Ministry happens as people share their hopes and dreams, their fears and their failings. Ministry can happen anywhere or at any time. Ministry is the work of all of God's people. Some people though are called or set aside for specific roles of ministry within the community of faith. Pastor or Deacon, even Synodically Authorized Ministers in training for ordination are set aside to serve. Who will step into these roles in the years to come? Troubling Numbers... We have gone through the spring assignment process – Western North Dakota was blessed to receive 2 candidates. We are thankful to God for these individuals however we reported 12 congregations or parishes in need of a first call candidate. Across the entire church, we are dealing with a declining number of individuals entering seminary. Many of those who are entering seminary are not from rural places, so the thought of serving in a rural setting is unsettling for many.

What shall we do? Whether or not your congregation has an opening at this moment should not matter, because we are in this together. The truth is that in the last 5 years 65% of our congregations have been or are in the call process. This is our issue together; both town and country churches have openings. Some have been waiting up to three years for the right candidate. All of us can keep our eyes open for people whom we believe have the gifts for service within the church. Pray for them and encourage them to consider serving the church as a pastor or deacon. We all can financially support those who are in seminary, as concern over educational debt is one of the hurdles facing candidates considering seminary.

Discernment Retreats...We are noticing that the more we talk about the need for qualified candidates, the more people begin to ask questions. We are in conversation with a number of people about the possibility of entering into theological education. Our next Discernment Retreat is scheduled for June 23-24 at Camp of the Cross. At this event individuals will have a chance to ask questions, talk with others who are wrestling with a call to ministry, as well as worship and pray together.
