#### "Anything can happen." (Mark 9:23b)

It's certainly been a long few months of *anything* and seemingly *everything* happening! We've all lived it and continue to live it! Let's be honest.... These past months have been a mix feelings and a mess of emotions. As we gathered with the Rostered Ministers of our Synod for retreat and learning in Medora a few weeks ago, our time of rest and renewal was centered on a guiding Scripture from Mark 9:14-29 (Message). This gathering – the people and the focus – was exactly what I needed. What many in attendance needed. Perhaps what many of you may need?

Rev. Lisa Lewton (St. John, Dickinson) captured our time and the message in a recent eloquent blog entitled, **"When One Feeling Isn't Enough"**. She consented to sharing it with you. Thank you, Pastor.

Last week, I spent a few days with my colleagues in Western North Dakota at an annual theological retreat. We both retreated by resting and catching up, and engaged in theological learning and discussion. It's no secret that Western North Dakota is not the most desirable location in the country to do ministry! Lutherans leaders often prefer to land in a metro area, and so what leaders in other areas might miss is a tight-knit collegial community. It is tight-knit because we know we need each other to survive! There is no sense of competition among churches, but instead a culture of support. And so when the conversation at our retreat centered around processing the past year and looking ahead at the work yet to do, there was a flood of feelings. There was grief and hope, disappointment and gratitude, mercy and frustration, all at once.

Did you know you can feel at least two feelings at once? You do it all the time. You feel love for your spouse and also utter shock that the two of you are still married. You feel gratitude for your child and ongoing irritation that said child continues to leave a trail of messiness throughout the house. You feel content in your life at the same time you feel curious that there might be something more.

There are so many feelings in the world right now! It might be helpful to remember your neighbor may be as confused about her feelings as you are about yours. I live in one of the Covid-sickest parts of the country, so while I'm grateful people have started reconnecting at the church I serve, I feel deep concern for people's health. Should we be gathering? I think, yes. Should we be cautious? Also yes. Is it good for our souls to gather in the same space? Absolutely yes. Even now? I think, yes.

Argh. It's no small task to be human these days, with so many feelings bubbling inside of us. I encourage you today to take note of your feelings. Here is <u>a link with a list of feelings</u> (https://baynvc.org/list-of-feelings/) if you need some help. Then, you might ask a friend or people in your family to do the same. My very favorite tool to engage you in conversation around feelings with your own self or with others feelings are <u>GROK cards</u> (https://groktheworld.com/).

There is a lot going on in your life if you start to dig around a bit. As I learned in a room full of pastors, deacons and a flood of feelings, naming the truth of what we are experiencing is an invitation for Christ's healing love.

I pray you find healing in Christ's love.

# A Message from FLC Stewardship Committee

#### Is Your Church Also A Business?

It's a phrase I've heard many times: "The church is also a business." And I understand the rationale behind that phrase. It's true that the church, like a business, is an entity with property to maintain, bills to pay, personnel to manage and so on. It also has a stream of income and expenses to be paid. However, to take the analogy any further could be a grave mistake. I believe this mistaken mindset has harmed our ability to do ministry and raise funds in support of it. The church should be looking for a *prophet*, not a <u>profit</u>.

There is a much deeper theological discussion here that I will leave you to explore with your local pastor, but the point I want to make here is simply this: When we compare the church to a business we are looking to the wrong example, particularly when it comes to raising funds.

The church does not have a product or service to sell, nor does it (or at least should not) have investors who expect a return on their investment. So, a better analogy would be to compare the church to other not-for-profit organizations. The church certainly has more in common with the local food shelf than it does the local grocery store.

When it comes to raising monies to fund the work of the church there are some great lessons to be learned from our not-for-profit neighbors. So, what can successful not-for-profits teach the church?

**Lesson #1: Cash is not king.** An interesting study was published in 2018 by Professor Russell James of Texas Tech University, Lubbock, TX. The study tracked over one million not-for-profit organizations from 2010 to 2016. The study found not-for-profits that only solicited cash donations managed to grow their revenues at a rate roughly equal to inflation. Those that also sought out non-cash gifts (mostly securities, but any tangible goods) grew their revenues by a remarkably higher rate (65% more). Add to this an IRS statistic that says 98% of the average American's wealth (and therefore their ability to give) resides in non-cash assets. The average church only asks for gifts of cash. The church needs to embrace non-cash giving.

**Lesson #2: Endowments are a key to long-term success.** Successful not-for-profits have long known the value of endowments (sometimes referred to as "perpetual funds"). These funds are often built on special legacy gifts – gifts that come through bequests or from large, accumulated assets that may represent a donor's lifetime of work. Because they represent such long-term, hard-earned wealth they are not likely to be given to the annual fund. These donors prefer their gifts to be put to work (invested) rather than simply spent. They prefer that only the growth in value be used to fund the mission of the not-for-profit. Endowments provide a steady stream of income that does not depend on annual donations. And this income is not generally subject to temporary economic downturns. Over time, these accumulating gifts can become a substantial part of the organization's overall funding. A strong endowment assures the not-for-profit is in it for the long haul. The church needs to embrace endowment giving.
