### A MESSAGE FROM THE OFFICE OF THE BISHOP - 2023 SYNOD ASSEMBLY SUMMARY

Over 230 members of the Western North Dakota Synod gathered together in Bismarck June 2-4, 2023 for Synod Assembly. The theme for the Assembly was "Welcomed | Included | Called | Equipped." The WND Synod Why Statement guided this theme – "to encourage and equip the ministries of the Western North Dakota Synod – ELCA, so that the Good News of Jesus Christ is proclaimed, and all God's children feel welcomed and included in the ministries to which God calls us."

Pre-Assembly Events: Pre-assembly festivities began Friday morning as synod council prepared to welcome voting members and guests from across the synod, as well as shift the leadership responsibilities of the assembly since our Assembly Manager was not able to be present this year. We give thanks for the strong leadership of our synod staff and synod council in the many ways they went above and beyond this year. And hold our Assembly Manager, Sherie Heine in prayer as she continues down a path to healing. Pre-assembly workshop attendees had the opportunity to attend 2 of 3 options Friday afternoon. Deacon John Weit, Executive for Worship of the ELCA, offered a workshop on the new ELCA worship resource All Creation Sings; Dr. Michael Chan, Executive for Faith and Learning at Concordia College, presented the workshop Witness to the Work: Recovering the Spiritual Practice of Testimony; and Paul Marsh, WND Synod Stewardship Specialist from GSB Fundraising, offered a report on the synod's visioning process and invited a brainstorming session to help us continue this visioning work that has been underway for the past two years. Friday ended with an evening reception celebrating outdoor ministry. Summer staff from Badlands Ministries, Metigoshe Ministries, and Camp of the Cross Ministries – three of our synod's four bible camps – joined assembly participants sharing stories of faith and the gift of music. These gifted staff were blessed and sent to share the love of Jesus with children and adults across our synod.

Synod Assembly Worship: Worship on Saturday morning began with a Land Acknowledgement honoring our Indigenous siblings. The Rev. Robert Schmidt from Bethel and Bethlehem Lutheran Churches in New Town, ND served as our Assembly Chaplain and offered the sermon during opening worship and prayer throughout the assembly. Again this year, Sunday offered the entire synod an opportunity to worship together as Bishop Schweitzer shared a message with the assembly that was also shared via video or read by lay ministers in local congregations gathering in worship across the synod. This shared message offered an opportunity to celebrate our unity and connection even as we are dispersed in communities across this prairie.

Rostered Minister anniversaries were recognized during closing worship. Additionally, all rostered and synod authorized ministers received a blessing from Bishop Schweitzer and the assembly. All voting members also participated in a blessing and sending for mission to go and share the good news of Jesus across the synod.

**Bible Study:** Dr. Michael Chan also served as our bible study leader throughout assembly. He offered four different bible studies that lifted up the four words of our theme using texts from Acts 9, Isaiah 56, Exodus 3-4, Jeremiah 1, Proverbs 2:1-15, and Proverbs 9:7-12. **Synod Book Read:** Bishop Craig Satterlee, bishop of the North West Lower Michigan Synod and author of the book You are Witnesses to These Things: Sharing the Story of Jesus, introduced the assembly to his latest book and the important role that sharing the story of Jesus has on living out our baptismal promises. Bishop Schweitzer is inviting and encouraging every synod congregation to read this book in 2023. An online book read will be offered this fall.

**Partner Ministries:** Throughout the assembly, we heard of the ways we are being invited to share the story of Jesus through our welcome, inclusion, calling, and equipping as a synod. Ministries featured this year included the work of the churchwide expression of the ELCA, Mission Investment Fund, Lutheran Immigration and Refugee Services of North Dakota (LIRS-ND), Concordia College, Lutheran Campus Ministry at Minot State University, and many, many more.

**ELCA Presiding Bishop Elizabeth Eaton** shared a video message about living out our baptismal calling in an ever-changing church and world. We've always been an immigrant church, and in most places of the church today that looks different than it has ever looked before. Bishop Eaton concluded her video message by saying "We know that the gospel changes lives. And as the world changes, we seek new ways to share the good news of Jesus with our neighbors. Together, we got out into our communities to share the love of Jesus, so that all may come to know God's grace in action. And together, we are called to offer our gratitude. First to God, for the grace given to us through Christ Jesus, and to you, who have faithfully served Christ's church in so many ways. Together, we are called."

**Conference Caucuses:** Caucuses are a time for voting members from geographic areas of the synod to meet one another and engage in conversation and prayer about the hopes and challenges of ministry in their local communities. We give thanks to our Conference Deans who led the caucuses and also provided leadership in several other capacities throughout the assembly.

Assembly Workshops: A variety of workshops were offered Saturday afternoon for learning and equipping, covering a variety of topics – an emerging lay preaching academy, stewardship best practices, utilizing volunteers, updates regarding a social statement being developed regarding faith and civic engagement, a workshop on Native American spirituality and Lutheran theology, updates regarding our work with Lutheran Immigration and Refuge Service of North Dakota, a wonderful offering on building consensus when we don't always agree, and a time of questions and conversation with Bishop Schweitzer.

Resolution Concerning Amendments to the Synod Constitution Action: Passed The Assembly considered a resolution to amend the synod constitution following the updates adopted at the 2022 ELCA Churchwide Assembly.

Resolution Concerning Amendments to the Synod Constitution Action: Passed The Assembly considered a resolution to strike language in the synod constitution that referred to board membership with Lutheran Social Services of North Dakota. Resolution Concerning Pulpit Supply Compensation Action: Passed The Assembly considered a resolution to offer compensation and expense recommendations to congregations utilizing pulpit supply. A draft covenant was also offered in the resolution should congregations choose to use such a document. Resolution Offering Anniversary Greetings to Our Companion Synod of the Lutheran Church in the Central African Republic Action: Passed The Assembly considered a resolution to offer greetings and congratulations to our global companion synod in the Central African Republic as they celebrate 100 years of life in the Gospel. And that we recommit ourselves to future ministry together as companions with them and the Lord in the common work to which our Lord calls us. We also received a video greeting from Bishop Joseph Ngoe from ELC-CAR.

*Parish Ed:* Janell S. reported that tomorrow May 10th will be the confirmation banquet and Sunday May 14th will be confirmation Sunday. Senior recognition will be on Sunday May 21st. VBS with Metigoshe Ministries will be June 26th − 30th for kids entering 1st through 6th grade.

*Vinje:* Joe K. reported Senior College Scholarships in the amount of \$500.00 each was granted for Emmett Kersten, Rebecca Benson, Danica Medlang, Conner Radke, Joss Olson and Emma Rybchinski

*Property/Security:* Brian K. reported that Air Conditioners in all three offices have blown circuit boards. Parts are not made anymore. Cost to replace all three is approximately \$6,000.00. Brian K. will check to see if this is covered under insurance. **Motion** to approve cost to replace all three air conditioners by Janell Shannon, second by Sheila B. **Motion** carried.

*Evangelism:* Mike A. reported committee is working on the talent show to be held in the back parking lot on June 2nd. They are working on flyers. Planning to have three divisions with 1st place payouts. 2 tents will be set up for over the stage and over the electrical panel. Endowment grant \$3,275.00 with donations also from Starion Financial, Thrivent, and Schepps.

Call Process update/Bishop Craig visit/Housing option: Bishop report there are 300 pastors looking for calls. Finding pastors to come to rural ND is the challenge. Pastor Carol asked the council to look into housing options as without a parsonage it may deter seminary graduates from coming. Brian K and Andrea B. will look into housing availability in Bottineau and the surrounding area. Council to think about options to offer candidates. For the month of July Property committee will discuss big projects and answer questions. ### UPDATE ON UKRAINIAN FAMILIES COMING TO BOTTINEAU

We are working with three families. Family information is found at the end of this update. We correspond with the families through Welcome.US and use Google Translate in order to understand each other! U.S. Customs and Immigration has granted permission for all individuals who will enter the U.S.

**English Skills:** One family knows basic English; the other two families know no English. We are establishing a program to help them learn and improve their English. We will focus on everyday conversation English and hope to work with the families as a group and individually for 6-8 hours a week.

<u>Timetable for Employment</u>: The families are most eager to become self-supporting. The Uniting for Ukraine program has expedited the process to get work visas. Each person will have their passport and when they go through U.S. Customs, they will be given the I-94 form. As soon as they get a Social Security Number (no need to wait for the card itself), they can begin working. Hopefully, the process will take no longer than 2-4 weeks.

**Religion:** Unknown. Two families speak of God and prayer. All are aware that six churches are sponsoring them.

**Housing:** We have rented two, two-bedroom apartments starting in July and one starting in August. We continue to pray for a three bedroom house.

When Families Will Arrive: The tentative plan is that two families will come in August and the third family is very uncertain.

**Efforts Getting Supplies:** We are following Lutheran Immigration and Refugee Services and Welcome.US suggested lists of what needs to be provided for the Ukrainian families. We have had tremendous community response and the next weeks we will be going through the supplies and furniture we have and then create a detailed list of what else is needed and circulate that information.

### **OUR FAMILIES**

### Diana Romanovska (34) and Ihor Baltiansky (35) and Damir (born May 29, 2023).

They live in Odessa. Diana described Ihor's skills as "master of electrics, plumbing, heating, built houses." She has not mentioned what she does. Neither one is employed because of the war. They are in the process of getting a passport for Damir. When they receive the passport, we will be able to complete the I-134A for Damir and he will be allowed to travel with them. In one letter, she indicated that they will have to wait three months after Damir's birth which means it might be late August before they come to Bottineau.

Olha (41) and Konstantin (42) Bondar, Artem (5) and Maksym (14). They live in Berdyansk, which is in southern Ukraine east of Odessa. Olha wrote that they have a mixed marriage: "she is Ukrainian and he is Russian" although they have both lived in the same providence all their lives. This is the family waiting for approval for Konstantin to come to Bottineau. Konstantin was a sailor who worked as navigator for oil tankers. He is unemployed because of the war. "The husband knows how to do everything like a handyman. He can repair cars, work with welding, cut wood and metal, process and paint surfaces, and assemble furniture. He can work as a plumber, electrician, and construction worker with cement and concrete. He built our house himself." She teaches Ukrainian language and does landscaping. She also wrote," My husband and I love to grow plants, vegetables, fruit trees. We have our own garden. Olha wrote, "We both know how and love to work on the land, grow plants and run a farm. I can also do a lot of manual work around the house, cleaning, painting, doing crafts, landscaping." They have 6 pear trees, 3 apple trees and 2 cherry trees. They know basic English but are concerned about speaking it. (That explains why she has written so much more than the other families, we would guess.) Maksym has finished the 8th grade. He teaches English in his school and enjoys swimming, cycling and "any other sports."

We have not had contact with Ohla and Konstantin for a month. They live in Russian occupied Ukraine and the Russians shut off all communication for a couple weeks earlier in our conversations. We are most concerned about their welfare. There is no timeline for their arrival in Bottineau. (If this family cannot come, we would like to invite another family.)

Anna (35) and Viktor Dovhal (41) and Yevhenii (15). They live in Kremenchuk, which is north of Odessa and Berdynsk. He is a trolley driver and she worked in a factory until it was destroyed by the Russians. They are coming in August. Viktor recently became unemployed because of the war. He is taking driving lessons hoping he will be able to drive when he comes to the U.S. Viktor has a medical issue (we could not understand the translation.) Yevhenni has finished the 9th grade. He enjoys cycling, computer games and chess. They are bombed nightly and Viktor wrote that the Russians have planted bombs around a near nuclear plant. He concluded a recent note writing, "...so we live for one day but try to make plans for the future."
